EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to declare the Third District of Palawan as a mining-free zone.

The Third District of Palawan vaunts of a mantel of rainforests, magnificent mountains, prehistoric caves, pristine dive sites and beaches.

Among many others, its virgin forests are rich in minerals such as mercury, copper and nickel, all of which are sought after by miners.

Section 16, Article II of the 1987 Constitution explicitly provides that "The State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature." As citizens of the Philippines, we have the intergenerational responsibility to preserve and protect the environment that is capable of sustaining life. The said right carries with it the correlative duty to refrain from impairing the environment.

Mining in the Third District of Palawan is said to have destroyed forests and caused siltation of water sources. While mining provides job opportunities for

some, the degree of damage to the earth, on the livelihood of farmers and Palaweños' general well-being has become exceptionally alarming.

Thus, in order to protect and preserve the natural environment of the Third District of Palawan, immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT DECLARING THE THIRD DISTRICT OF PALAWAN AS A MINING FREE ZONE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Statement of Policy. - It is the policy of the State to protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony of nature. Towards this end, the State shall protect the people and the environment of the Third District of Palawan composed of the City of Puerto Princesa and the Municipality of Aborlan against the adverse effects of mining.

SECTION 2. Declaration of the Third District of Palawan as a Mining Free Zone. — The Third District of Palawan City composed of the City of Puerto Princesa and the Municipality of Aborlan is hereby declared as a mining free zone; thereby all forms of mining activity within its territorial jurisdiction is prohibited.

For the purpose of this Act, mining shall refer to the extraction of valuable minerals or other geological materials, excluding gravel and sand marble,"

inclusive of mining activities as exploration, feasibility, development, utilization and processing.

SECTION 3. Penal Provisions. – Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Act shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment of not less than six (6) years and one (1) day but not more than twelve (12) years or a fine of not less than one hundred thousand (P100,000.00) pesos but not more than five hundred thousand (P500,000.00) pesos, or both, at the discretion of the court.

If the offense is committed by a corporation, partnership, association or any other juridical entity, the penalty shall be imposed on the president, managing director, partner or chief operating officer. The license to operate of the erring corporation, partnership, association or any other juridical entity shall be cancelled and revoked permanently. The operator or owner thereof shall not be allowed to operate similar establishments in a different name or in a different location.

If the offender is a foreigner, he shall after service of sentence or payment of fine, be subject to deportation and permanently barred from entering the country.

SECTION 4. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – The Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) shall formulate the necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. – If any portion or provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or the provisions not affected thereby shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 6. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
